Tournament News

Schedule Change

The tournament scheduled for San Juan Oaks on September 5th was preempted for the Fred Couple's Skins Game to be played on that weekend. That date has been filled with a tournament at the new Cinnabar Hills golf course in south San Jose.

Tahoe Weekend

The turnout for the Lake Tahoe "Get-Away" weekend has been tremendous. As of the deadline, 41 people had sent in reservations. This represents one of the highest attendance for this weekend since the club initiated the event in 1983.

As we have always gone on these August weekend tournaments, optional pot games will be included. The games to be played are described below. They will be conducted by Joe Zukowski and Steve Jedynak.

18 Hole Net

Players play 18 holes using full course handicap. Prizes are awarded to the top four places. This game will be conducted on all 3 days. Cost is \$5 per day.

36 Hole Net

Players play 36 holes using full course handicap. This game will only cover play for Saturday and Sunday. Prizes are awarded to the top five places. Cost is \$10.

Net Skins

Players will use full course handicaps with strokes applied as they fall on the card according to handicap hole and tees played (blue, white or red). Low net score on a hole wins a skin. One tie all tie for a hole. No carry-overs. The pot for the day will be divided by the number of skins won with each winner receiving an equal share. This game will be conducted on all three days. Cost is \$5 per day.

Modified Stableford

Players will use full course handicap with strokes applied as they fall on the card according to handicap hole and tees played (blue, white or red). Points will be awarded for **net score** on each hole (8 for net double eagle, 5 for net eagle, 2 for net birdie, 0 for net par, -1 for net bogey and -3 for net double bogey or worse). Prizes to the top four places. This game will be conducted on all three days. Cost is \$5 per day.

Kickers

This game does not require an established handicap. The concept for this game is: At the end of the round the tournament committee will draw a number that is within the range of 60-70. Before the start of the round, each player will select a handicap (*no restrictions are placed on handicap size*) based on what the player thinks he/she will shoot for that round. That handicap will then be subtracted from the round's gross score. The net scores (*only those between 60 & 70, inclusively*) that equal or come closest to the number drawn wins. Prizes to the closest four places. This game will be conducted on Saturday and Sunday only. Cost is \$5 per day. As we do every year, questions will be answered and explanations of the format will be provided at the course when requested.

Fewest Putts

Only strokes taken on the putting surface are counted. (*Clarification - any stroke that requires the pin to be removed from the hole is considered a putt*). Prizes to the top four places. This game will be conducted on all three days. Cost is \$5 per day.

Closest to the Hole

The player whose tee shot comes to rest closest to the hole wins. Each par 3 will be included. The pot for the day will be divided by the number of holes marked. This game will be conducted on all three days. Cost is \$5 per day.



Rules of Golf

Many of you may have recently viewed commercials on TV about hand held Electronic Distance Measuring (EDM) devices that look similar in appearance to binoculars. These devices are used to provide the player with distances from a specific spot to another spot, most often the flag. There are also EDMs that are cart mounted.

The USGA Rules of Golf expressly prohibits the use of "any artificial device or unusual equipment for the purpose of gauging or measuring distance". EDMs fall into this category. The Rules, as may have been implied by some companies, have not been amended to allow the use of EDMs for "handicap play". The problem with EDMs is not in the information (yardage) being obtained, but rather in the means (electronic device) by which it is gathered (lasers, GPS, etc.).

The Rules of Golf make no distinction between competitive and recreational golf. One of the unique aspects of our game is that the Rules apply whenever you play. However, this does not mean that if an EDM is used during a "casual" round, that score can not be posted for the purposes of maintaining your handicap. In 1994 the USGA Rules of Golf and Handicap Committees determined that rounds played using EDMs must be posted for handicap computational purposes as long as the device only measured distance and/or provided an illustration of the hole. This position by the USGA parallels that which exists for the posting of scores when a Local Rule permits "winter rules" or "preferred lies". The purpose of this position is to capture as many scores as possible for an individual so as to ensure a handicap that accurately reflects that person's potential ability.

If the information being presented by companies promoting EDMs and the USGA's position and rules on these devices seem conflicting and may cause confusion, there is one thing that will always be true. If you apply the Rules of Golf whenever you play a round of golf you will never be wrong and you will be doing your best to maintain the integrity and tradition of the game.

The following is Rule 14-3 covering the use of artificial devices.

Rule 14. Striking the Ball

14.3 Artificial Devices and Unusual Equipment

A player in doubt as to whether use of an item would constitute a breach of Rule 14-3 should consult the United States Golf Association.

A manufacturer may submit to the United States Golf Association a sample of an item which is to be manufactured for a ruling as to whether its use during a stipulated round would cause a player to be in breach of Rule 14-3. Such sample will become the property of the United States Golf Association for reference purposes. If a manufacturer fails to submit a sample before manufacturing and/or marketing the item, he assumes the risk of a ruling that use of the item would be contrary to the Rules of Golf.

Except as provided in the Rules, during a stipulated round the player shall not use any artificial device or unusual equipment:

- a. Which might assist him in making a stroke or in his play; or
- b. For the purpose of gauging or measuring distance or conditions which might affect his play; or
- c. Which might assist him in gripping the club, except that:
 - (i) plain gloves may be worn;
 - (ii) resin, powder and drying or moisturizing agents may be used;
 - (iii) tape or gauze may be applied to the grip (provided such application does not render the grip non-conforming under Rule 4-1c; and
 - (iv) a towel or handkerchief may be wrapped around the grip.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF RULE 14-3; *Disqualification*

Definitions referenced in this Rule.

Committee

The "Committee" is the committee in charge of the competition or, if the matter does not arise in a competition, the committee in charge of the course.

Stipulated Round

The "stipulated round" consists of playing the holes of the course in their correct sequence unless otherwise authorized by the Committee. The number of holes in a stipulated round is 18 unless a smaller number is authorized by the Committee. As to extension of stipulated round in match play see Rule 2-3.

Rule 2-3. Winner of Match

A match (which consists of a stipulated round, unless otherwise decreed by the Committee) is won

by the side which is leading by a number of holes greater than the number of holes remaining to be played.

The Committee may, for the purpose of settling a tie, extend the stipulated round to as many holes as are required for a match to be won.

Did You Know?

The following tidbits of information about California golf appeared in the June issue of the Golf Journal.

The Northern California Golf Association provides more handicap indexes (190,000) to its members than any other state or regional association. The Southern California Golf Association is second (150,000), still well ahead of the (New York) Metropolitan Golf Association (110,000).

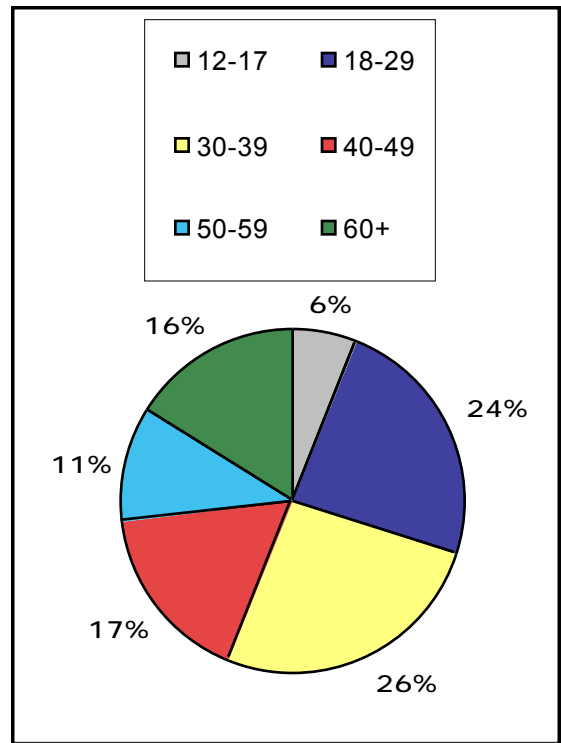


According to the National Golf Foundation, California ranks 31st in the percentage of residents 12 and older who play golf. Among the states rated higher: Iowa, North and South Dakota, Montana, Vermont, Nevada, New Hampshire and New Mexico.

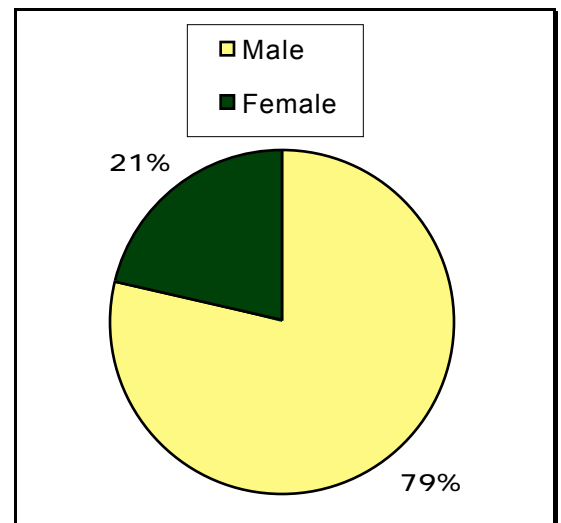


There are 2.66 million golfers in California. That leads every other state and represents 10.14% of all golfers in the United States.

7 and 6 - The margin by which famed baseball player Ty Cobb lost in the club championship at The Olympic Club to 12 year old and future pro Bob Rosberg. Cobb left the club shortly thereafter and never returned.



Construction costs to build Pebble Beach when it opened in the late-1910s was an estimated \$100,000. When Riviera Country Club was built in the mid-1920s, it was done so at a cost of \$625,000, making it the most expensive golf course in the country at that time.



Burlingame Country Club in Hillsborough, which dates back to 1893, bills itself as the oldest golf course west of the Mississippi. Redlands Country Club in San Bernardino County, was built in 1896 and was expanded to 18 holes in 1927. In 1987, Old Del Monte Golf Course made its debut. It is believed to be the oldest course west of the Mississippi in continuous use. In 1901, it expanded to 18 holes and was reported to be the first course in the world to have green fairways year around.



Pebble Beach Golf Links has more oceanside holes (eight) than any course on the west coast. There are only five courses in Southern California (Pelican Hill, The Links at Monarch Beach, Sandpiper, and the North and South courses at Torrey Pines) with holes along the Pacific Ocean.



More than 8,000 feet separate the state's highest course (Snowcreek G.C. in Mammoth Lakes, 7,800 feet above sea level) and the lowest (Furnace Creek G.C. in Death Valley, 214 feet below sea level).

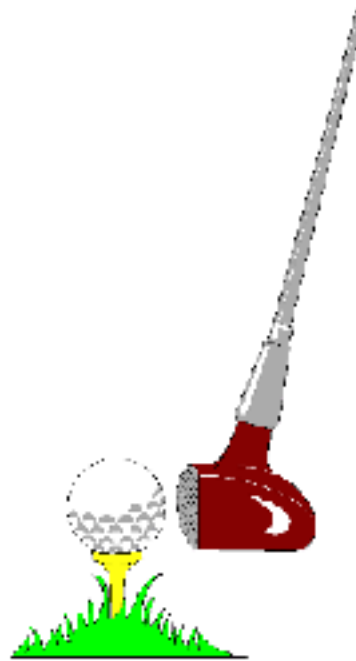
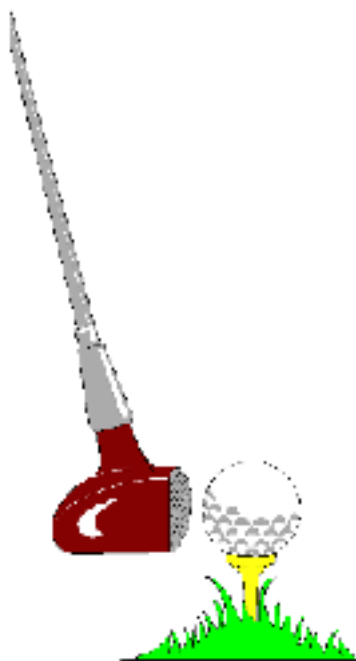


Upcoming Tournaments

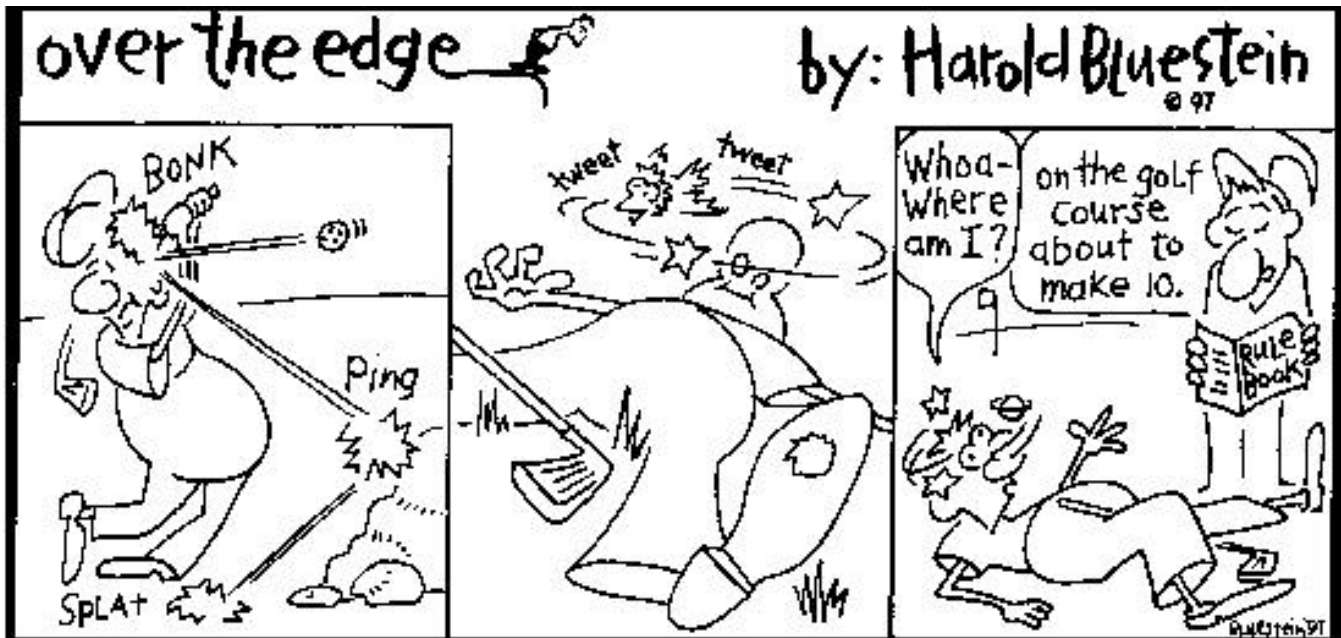
