Tournament News

Las Positas

The Las Positas tournament scheduled for May 31st has been canceled. The cancellation was due to an oversight by the course in the scheduling of our tournament on a date that conflicted with the annual Livermore City Two-Man Best Ball Championship. If you had signed up for this tournament, a full refund will be returned. Using established club procedures, we will not provide a credit for

any future tournaments since this creates unwanted bookkeeping problems for us.

Tournament Sign-ups

We previously brought to your attention the need to get sign-ups in before the established deadline. When mailing in your sign-ups, it is important to put a legible address on the envelope. We have recently been experiencing delayed delivery of mail because of poorly or illegibly addressed letters. When sign-ups are received late, no matter what the cause, and times are released back to the course we can not get them back.

Nevada Week-End (August 22-24)

Included with this issue is a sign-up for the August weekend at Carson City. The package rates include Friday and Saturday night lodgings and Saturday and Sunday golf. Friday golf is optional and is not included in the package price. Additional night lodgings are available at \$53.10 plus tax per night. Reservations for additional nights must be made with the club when you sign up but payment will be your responsibility when you check into the Inn. We have spaces for 40 golfers on Saturday and Sunday and 24 spaces for Friday. Spaces will be filled on a first come, first served basis.

As we have always gone on these August weekend tournaments, optional pot games will be included. The games that have been conducted before and what are intended this year are described below.

18 Hole Net

Players play 18 holes at full course handicap. Prizes are awarded to the top three places. This game will be conducted on all 3 days. Cost is \$5 per day.

36 Hole Net

Players play 36 holes at full course handicap. This game will only cover play for Saturday and Sunday. Prizes are awarded to the top five places. Cost is \$10.

Net Skins

Players will use full course handicaps with strokes applied as they fall on the card according to handicap hole and tees played (white or red). Low net score on a hole wins a skin. One tie all tie for a hole. The pot for the day will be divided by the number of skins won with each winner receiving an equal share. This game will be conducted on all three days. Cost is \$5 per day.

Point Par

Players will use full handicaps with strokes applied as they fall on the card according to handicap hole and tees played (white or red). Points will be awarded for net score on each hole (0 for double bogey or higher, 1 for bogey, 2 for par, 3 for birdie, 5 for eagle, 7 for double eagle). Prizes are awarded to the top three places. This game will be conducted on all three days. Cost is \$5 per day.

Kickers

This game does not require a handicap. The concept for this game is: At the end of the round the tournament committee will draw a number that is inclusively within the range of 60-70. Before the start of the round, each player will select a handicap (no restrictions are placed on the size of the handicap) based on what the player thinks he/she will shoot for that round. That handicap will then be subtracted from the round's gross score with the net score that equals or comes closest to the number drawn winning. Prizes are awarded to the closest three places. This game will be conducted on Saturday and Sunday only. Cost is \$5 per day. As we do every year, questions will be answered and explanations of the format will be provided at the course.

Fewest Putts

Only strokes taken on the putting surface are counted. Prizes are awarded to the top three places. This game will be conducted on all three days. Cost is \$5 per day.

Closest to the Hole

The player whose tee shot comes to rest closest to the hole wins. Each par 3 will be included. The pot for the day will be divided by the number of holes marked. This game will be conducted on all three days. Cost is \$2 per day.

Rules of Golf

Situation: Ricky hits his shot on a par three into the woods to the left of the green. To be safe, he hits a provisional and it goes in the hole. He tells Fred, his playing partner, that he is declaring the first ball lost and will play the provisional, thus making a par three on the hole. On the way to the hole, Fred decides to take a quick look in the woods and finds Ricky's first ball. Meanwhile, Ricky goes to the hole and pulls his provisional ball out of the hole. Fred tells Ricky he can't declare the ball lost if it's actually found and must play the original ball. Ricky says he didn't ask Fred to look for the ball, that he declared the ball lost and therefore he can play his provisional. Who's right?

Rule: Fred is right, but Ricky can still play his provisional. How's that? It doesn't matter if Ricky called Fred off or made no effort to look for the ball himself. If Fred finds Ricky's ball within five minutes, that ball is in play -- unless Ricky has removed his provisional ball from the cup before Fred found the original ball. If that happens, the provisional is deemed to be holed and the ball in play. So the issue here is the timing of when Fred found the ball and Ricky removed his provisional from the cup.

The question is what type of friend is Fred to go look for Ricky's ball? Or was he just following the Rules of Golf.

Rule 27-2 Provisional Ball

a. PROCEDURE

If a ball may be lost outside a water hazard or may be out of bounds, to save time the player may play another ball provisionally as nearly as possible at the spot from which the original ball was played (see Rule 20-5). The player shall inform his opponent in match play or his marker or fellow-competitor in stroke play that he intends to play a provisional ball, and shall play it before he or his partner goes forward to search for the original ball. If he fails to do so and plays another ball, such ball is not a provisional ball and becomes the ball in play under penalty of stroke and distance (Rule 27-1); the original ball is deemed to be lost.

b. WHEN PROVISIONAL BALL BECOMES BALL IN PLAY

The player may play a provisional ball until he reaches the place where the original ball is likely to be. If he plays a stroke with the provisional ball from the place where the original ball is likely to be or from a point nearer the hole than that place, the original ball is deemed to be lost and the provisional ball becomes the ball in play under penalty of stroke and distance.

c. WHEN PROVISIONAL BALL TO BE ABANDONED

If the original ball is neither lost outside a water hazard nor out of bounds, the player shall abandoned the provisional ball and continue play with the original ball. If he fails to do so, any further strokes played with the provisional ball shall constitute playing a wrong ball and the provisions of Rule 15 shall apply.

Note: If the original ball is in a water hazard, the player shall play the ball as it lies or proceed under Rule 26. If it is lost in a water hazard or unplayable, the player shall proceed under Rule 26 or 28, whichever is applicable.

In the example above, Ricky's provisional ball became the ball in play as soon as he picked it out of the hole and since Fred had not already found Ricky's original ball. Fred was simply following the Rules of Golf when he went to search for Ricky's original ball.



Tales from the Caddie Shack

Some True Golf Stories Told About:
Gary McCord

Back in the bad old days before he caught on as an announcer for CBS Sports, Gary McCord was just another guy struggling to make a living on the PGA Tour. Actually, it's not fair to label him as part of any single group. He's always been unique.

Not the least of his virtues is his willingness to press his luck. One time he was summoned to meet with Augusta National chairman Hord Hardin, who had the authority to approve McCord's participation in CBS's Masters coverage.

McCord and CBS producer/director Frank Chirkinian went to Hord's office, where Hardin explained the belief among Augusta's officials that the telecast should be reserved and dignified - two adjectives that don't usually spring to mind in connection with Gary's appeal as a broadcaster. As the meeting wound down, Hardin asked McCord if he have any questions.

"Just one. I guess this means I'm not wearing my clown suit, huh Hord?" McCord asked.



In the mid-1980's, *Golf Digest* sent a writer to California to do a profile on Gary McCord. The writer and McCord decided to fit in a little golf along with the interview. Since the writer didn't have any clubs, they drove to a rental warehouse where McCord was storing much of his worldly belongings - clubs, furniture, the works.

"You must not have much stuff left at home," the writer said.

"This is home," said McCord



In 1976, Gary McCord decided to test the Tour's policy on facial hair. He arrived at the Houston Open with a beard and was immediately told by officials to either shave or face a fine and suspension. McCord complied by cutting the beard back to a Fu Manchu. Soon after, he sent a copy of the Tour's regulations to the American Civil Liberties Union, which assured him that if he took the Tour to court he'd win. A couple of weeks later, the Tour told him he had to shave everything off. ACLU or no ACLU, McCord knew when he was beat. Out came the razor. Off came the mustache.
