Handicap Chairman's Corner

Scores for Posting

If you played a round and could not post at the course, those scorecards can be turned in to the club for posting. However, the following information must be provided on the card for correct posting:

- 1 Course Rating of the Tees Played.
- 2 Slope Rating of the Tees Played.
- 3 Person recording round.
- 4 Dated and signed.

Please check to see that the course rating and slope are on the card. Some cards are not printed with the slope rating. If they are not, hand write the slope rating on the card so that your round can be properly recorded.

Rules of Golf

RELIEF SITUATIONS AND PROCEDURE

Rule 20. *lifting, Dropping and Placing; Playing from Wrong Place*

(Continued)

20-3. Placing and Replacing

a. BY WHOM AND HOW

A ball to be placed under the Rules shall be placed by the player or his partner. If a ball is to be placed, the player, his partner or the person who lifted or moved it shall place it on the spot from which it was lifted or moved. In any such case, the player shall be responsible for any breach of the Rules.

If a ball or the ball-marker is accidentally moved in the process of placing or replacing the ball, the ball or the ball-

marker shall be replaced. There is no penalty provided the movement of the ball or the ball-marker is directly attributable to the specific act of placing or replacing the ball or removing the ball-marker. Otherwise, the player shall incur a penalty stroke under Rule 18-2a or 20-1.

b. LIE OF BALL TO BE PLACED OR REPLACED ALTERED

If the original lie of a ball to be placed or replaced has been altered:

(i) except in a hazard, the ball shall be placed in the nearest lie most similar to the original lie which is not more than one club-length from the original lie, not nearer the hole and not in a hazard;

(ii) in a water hazard, the ball shall be placed in accordance with Clause (i) above, except that the ball must be placed in the water hazard;

(iii) in a bunker, the original lie shall be recreated as nearly as possible and the ball shall be placed in that lie.

c. SPOT NOT DETERMINABLE

If it is impossible to determine the spot where the ball is to be placed or replaced:

(i) through the green, the ball shall be dropped as near as possible to the place where it lay but not in a hazard;

(ii) in a hazard, the ball shall be dropped in the hazard as near as possible to the place where it lay;

(iii) on the putting green, the ball shall be placed as near as possible to the place where it lay but not in a hazard.

d. BALL FAILS TO REMAIN ON SPOT

If a ball when placed fails to remain on the spot on which it was placed, it shall be replaced without penalty. If it still fails to remain on that spot:

(i) except in a hazard, it shall be placed at the nearest spot not nearer the hole or in a hazard where it can be placed at rest;

(ii) in a hazard, it shall be placed in the hazard at the nearest spot not near the hole where it can be placed at rest.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF RULE 20-3:

Match play - Loss of hole; Stroke play - Two strokes

20-7. Playing from Wrong Place

For a ball played from outside the teeing ground or from a wrong teeing ground - see Rule 11-4 and -5.

a. MATCH PLAY

If a player plays a stroke with a ball which has been dropped or placed in a wrong place, *he shall lose the hole*.

b. STROKE PLAY

If a competitor plays a stroke with (i) his original ball which has been dropped or placed in a wrong place, (ii) a substituted ball which has been dropped or placed under an applicable Rule but in a wrong place or (iii) his ball in play when it has been moved and not replaced in a case where the Rules require replacement, *he shall*, provided a serious breach has not occurred, *incur the penalty prescribed by the applicable Rule* and play out the hole with the ball.

If after playing from a wrong place, a competitor becomes aware of that fact and believes that a serious breach may be involved, he may, provided he has not played a stroke from the next teeing ground or, in the case

of the last hole of the round, left the putting green, declare that he will play out the hole with a second ball dropped or placed in accordance with the Rules. The competitor shall report the facts to the Committee before returning his score card; if he fails to do so, *he shall be disqualified*. The Committee shall determine whether a serious breach of the Rule occurred. If so, the score with the second ball shall count and *the competitor shall add two penalty strokes to his score with that ball*.

If a serious breach has occurred and the competitor has failed to correct it as prescribed above, *he shall be disqualified*.

Note: If a competitor plays a second ball, penalty strokes incurred by playing the ball ruled not to count and strokes subsequently taken with that ball shall be disregarded.

Decisions on Rule 20-3.

Placed Ball Rolls into Hole

Q. A replaces his ball on the putting green. As he is about to address the ball, it rolls into the hole. Should the ball be replaced or is A deemed to have holed out with this previous stroke?

A: The answer depends on whether the ball, when replaced, remained at rest for a few seconds before it started rolling. If it did, A is deemed to have holed out with his previous stroke. If not, A is required to replace the ball - Rule 20-3d.

Whether Player Himself Must Place or Replace Ball

Q. Rule 20-3a states: "A ball to be placed under the Rules shall be placed by the player or his partner. If a ball is to be placed, the player, his partner or the person who lifted or moved it shall place it on the spot from which it was lifted or moved." On the other hand, other Rules, e.g., Rules 15-2 and -3 and 18-2b and -2c state that the player shall place or replace the ball. Does Rule 20-3a override other Rules which imply that the player himself must place or replace the ball?

A: Yes. (Revised)

Decisions on Rule 20-4.

Ball Replace on Putting Green But Ball-Marker Not Removed; Ball Then Moves

Q. A player replaces his ball on the putting green but does not remove his ball-marker. Subsequently the wind moves his ball to a new position. What is the ruling?

A: Under Rule 20-4, a ball is in play when it is replaced, whether or not the object used to mark its position has been removed. Consequently the ball must be played from the new position.
